The main work at this point will be to familiarize and understand the regulations and standards and its applicability in the local concept. Initially the person might find it complex and technical, but as the individual builds up experience and understands the technicalities the person shouldn't find it difficult.

**5.** SCOPE & EFFECT OF WORK: Describe the purpose, breath of work performance, and the effect the work has on the work of others or the functions of the organization.

At this level the person will not be involved directly with the actual technical issues; therefore the person should have the aptitude to learn things. What the person does in this position will have an impact on the safety of the airline and the passengers traveling therein. It is everyone in the flight operations section that has an impact on the safe flight of an aircraft. At this position the person will not be able to make much impact on the actual technical functions of the Section, but will be more of a helping hand to the senior colleagues.

# 6. INSTRUCTION AND GUIDELINES AVILIABLE:

**6.1 Instruction:** Describe controls exercised over the work by the Superior; how work is assigned, reviewed and evaluated.

The person will take instructions directly from the Flight Safety Officer. The person will also receive instructions from the Director. The instructions could be in various forms, written, verbal, memos etc.

**6.2 Guidelines:** Indicate which written or unwritten guidelines are available, and the extent to which the employees may interpret, adapt or devise new guidelines.

There is no shortage of guidelines available with the section. The person will be guided by the Civil Aviation Act, Bhutan Air Navigation Regulations, ICAO annexes, JAR documents, and the inspectors' manual, handbooks etc.

7. WORK RELATIONSHIPS: Indicate the frequency, nature and purpose of contacts with others within and outside the assigned organization (other than contacts with superiors):

The Assistant Flight Safety Officer works under the supervision of the Flight Safety officer. He will also need to constantly liaise with other Sections within the

Department like airworthiness, aerodrome, ATC and with the airline and the common public sometimes. So the person should possess a good work relationships, and interpersonal skills.

**8. SUPERVISION OVER OTHERS:** Describe responsibility for supervision of other employees, including the nature of supervisory responsibilities and classification and number of subordinates.

Since the person is in the lowest line in flight operations, there is no supervisory function related to this job.

**9. JOB ENVIROMENT:** Describe physical exercise required, such as walking standing, lifting objects, etc., and /or any risk or discomforts such as exposure to chemicals, climbing to heights, extreme weather conditions, or other severe discomforts.

The job involves mainly working in the field. It does not involve significant physical exertion but could involve a great deal of psychological and mental exertion. The job could involve physical exposure to risky environments when conducting field inspection on aircraft, auditing of Operations base, ramp etc.
