4. What is marketing mix or "4 Ps" of marketing framework? Briefly explain each of the "4 Ps" of marketing. **(6 marks)**
5. Define ovariohysterectomy. List three immediate/short-term and two long-term possible post-operative complications of ovariohysterectomy. **(6 marks)**
6. Define bovine estrous cycle and name its four main phases. **(6 marks)**

1. Discuss the multifactorial nature of mastitis in dairy cows. Explain the key roles of environmental and infectious factors in its occurrence. Propose a comprehensive mastitis control program for a commercial dairy farm, detailing the management practices for both milking and dry periods. **(20 marks)**
2. Discuss the principles of biosecurity in modern livestock farming. Explain how a well-designed biosecurity program can mitigate the risk of disease outbreaks, improve herd health, and enhance overall farm productivity. Provide specific examples of internal and external biosecurity measures. **(20 marks)**
3. Discuss the principles and applications of estrus synchronization as a cornerstone of modern livestock breeding programs. Explain the hormonal mechanisms involved in any one of the synchronization protocols. Furthermore, evaluate the economic benefits and potential challenges of implementing an estrus synchronization program on a commercial farm, considering both time-based and cost-based factors. **(20 marks)**
4. Analyze the key factors to consider when developing a farm business plan for a new livestock enterprise. Discuss the importance of market analysis, financial projections, and risk management in ensuring the long-term sustainability and profitability of the operation. **(20 marks)**
